Christmas Nativity

A Christmas nativity is probably one of the most recognisable symbols of the Christmas season. Nativities are art, models, carvings, or live demonstrations depicting the night of Jesus' birth. These scenes generally contain the same elements: Jesus in a manger; His mother, Mary; His earthly father, Joseph; shepherds; angels; various barn animals; and sometimes three wise men.




Tom Appleby – Convict Boy Throughout this semester, MP have been reading 'Tom Appleby – Convict Boy' by Jackie French. The themes are quite powerful and

include resilience, courage, relationships, open-mindedness, love, loss, empathy and perseverance. All these attributes are beneficial to any young person making their way in the world. MP-S have been reflecting on the journey. Tom is only 8 years old when he has already witnessed the loss of his father,

been sold in chimney sweeping, been starved and cold, shoeless and lonely....none of which any child should endure. He is then charged with theft and is transported to Australia on the First Fleet. Whilst I remember that this is a novel, through our research of the first Fleet, we discovered that children as young as Tom were actually sent to Australia. Over time,

the class has recognised that perseverance is one of the most important attributes for Tom to retain. Over the last week, students have created their own motivating quotes to assist with building their perseverance. As educators and parents, we are able to assist our children by ensuring they recognise situations where they or other have demonstrated perseverance. It can only be a win-win for us and our children.



SMOOTH TRANSITIONS

Transition This week saw the final morning of our Transition Program. Students have returned after each transition brimming with excitement – each transition better than

the last! We need to remember that the purpose of transition is to eradicate the unknown for each student. We don't always see anxiety. We don't always see the worry. We don't always hear the self talk. What we do see is students returning with a smile on their face. We see students feeling safe. We hear about their experience. We hear parents talk about their experience. The value of a strong transition program is immeasurable.

Well what another fantastic year in our Middle School 5-7. We have celebrated many wonderful events as a level as it all comes to another end. We continue to be keep our students productive and engaged in their learning. We would like all parents to ensure their child is attending each day and to be both physically and mentally present in order to complete the year on a high, especially as our secondary students go into their transition week next week. If your child is in Year 7, please ensure you have checked PAM online to see if any assessment tasks incomplete.

STEM Our Year 6 and 7 girls were invited by AIR4 to attend an excursion to Luna Park last week, where they learnt about the STEM program. This is the learning of science, technology, engineering and mathematics in an interdisciplinary or integrated approach. Students gain and apply knowledge, deepen their understanding and develop creative and critical thinking skills within an authentic context. This aims to engage females in these areas of study and our Year 6 and 7 girls were delighted to be involved as they learnt how STEM education is incorporated into the rides.

Some reflections from some our Year 6 girls included;

"We heard women talk to us about the AIR4 team and how they have become engineers, scientists and other related careers."

"We were given a backpack with a hat, drink bottle and information on STEM Education."

"We were spoilt with free lunch, drink, ice cream and chips."

"We had a woman mentor on one of the rides talk to us about their work and how they got involved with AIR4 as an engineer or pilot.

"It was a great day and a fun experience. Thanks to the teachers who took us."


