Sister Laraine Crowe rsj (St Joseph's of the Sacred Heart) has led NSW rural Catholic schools, worked on the Mary Mackillop Motor Mission supporting remote rural communities and in recent years worked closely in various dioceses to embed greater understandings of Aboriginal spirituality across Catholic networks. I learnt much from my early mentor but the phrase, "it's the smell of the place," were the most powerful words that resonated the most during my time leading a school community with this wonderful nun. The smell of the place is in the greeting you receive, the daily interactions between staff and students, the smiles on the faces of the students, the commitment the staff have to a holistic education and in the walk and talk given to students by dedicated teachers.

St Mary's is all the above and it is a privilege to work alongside the professional staff who set high standards and as equally are dedicated to the pastoral care of every child from prep to the teenage years. Earlier this week I asked a community member who catches a bus in the afternoon from St. Mary's what she knew about our school? The reply, "beautiful uniform and they care for me." High praise for our students who share the bus ride home.

I have met the enthusiastic P&F led by President, Karen Glen and look forward to journeying with the College Board led by Chair, Andrew Graham. Meeting weekly with Fr Ashkar keeps strong parish links and as a parish school in the Mercy Tradition, there is much to look forward to as our St Mary's community continues to create the future.

Many Catholic Schools began with lay teachers, as did St Mary's in 1880. The Colleges charism and ethos was established when the Sisters of Mercy arrived in 1900. The Mercy charism (meaning model of life and values) *Compassion; Justice; Respect; Hospitality; Service; Courage...are all values we want for our students to develop and remain with them, especially into their adult lives.* Hospitality was and is always a strong point of the Sisters of Mercy. The welcome and care of hospitality is very obvious to me since joining the College community. The spirit of the founder of the Mercy Sisters, Catherine McCauley is alive and well at St Mary's. Our students will continue to grow and mature and life will provide good and challenging times, but if the students know they are secure in the Mission and Values of St Mary's they too will build characters that understand difference and live out a strong sense of empathy. 

It is super important to every staff member to make

their students feel safe, valued and welcome. We are a week in and that seems to be the case. Our

Preps are arriving everyday with big smiles on their faces, so that is a good indication that we have done something right. The Prep-4 Team look forward to building strong and positive relationships with students and parents.

We welcome Miss Naomi Hanlon in Middle Primary. Naomi's class MPH, is settling well and she is looking forward to establishing great routines and with the kids and relationships with parents. Mrs. Shae Williams has returned to SMC in a greater capacity as Junior Primary teacher in JPW on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. Ms. Ally Yardley is joining Shae in JPW for Thursday and Friday.

As well as the new Preps, we are fortunate to have many new families across Prep-4. We look forward to getting know all our new students and their families in the coming weeks and months.





Level Emails have been sent home in the last few days. Each email talks about important dates, the weekly routine of the classroom and other important issues such as hats and uniform. It advises you of any changes to the routine in the coming week such as special events. Reading this email to your child allows them to be aware of and prepared for the week ahead. If you have any queries about your classroom, please see your child's teacher.

Mathematics with JPW We have been getting ourselves reacquainted with Mathematics. Before starting any new learning we discuss what it is and why it is so important for us to learn it. We also talk about how our brain is like a muscle and although we may not know things yet, we will if we exercise our brain with new challenges. This week we practised how to use equipment mathematically.



We discovered that there is a difference. We used the equipment to make patterns, sort, count and add. We discovered that maths equipment is fun to play with and reminded ourselves that during maths, we use the equipment mathematically. You might like to ask your child if they know the difference.









Middle Primary have begun their Inquiry Unit 'What makes our community hum?' We are exploring families, local communities and then wider environments. We aim for students to become aware that there are many communities around us that we may not be aware of and to shift our mindset towards some communities and their members.

If you are able to send to school or email the classroom teachers, we are looking for photos, artifacts etc. that show the communities your child participates in. These will be used as part of a display in each classroom.



Opening College Mass This Friday our College Opening Mass is at 9.00am. It is always a wonderful celebration of our school and the new year. Students have been learning a new song just for this Mass and it will be wonderfully uplifting for anyone listening! We welcome everyone at our Church on Friday.

Student Led Conversations This Monday and Tuesday we are conducting our Student Led Conversations with families. You are able to book an appointment to see your child's Homeroom teacher through PAM. Please contact your classroom teacher if you are having difficulty with this process. We look forward to seeing you next week.





Canteen lunches are available every day for the students. Each classroom has a labelled basket in which to put a lunch order. JP students are permitted to buy canteen food at lunchtime, but not at recess. All students are encouraged to place their order directly in the basket themselves as then they are aware that they are receiving

a Lunch Order and not worry that they have no lunch.

Sharing food and buying treats for other students is not a practice we encourage. If you would like your child to buy something from the canteen please ensure they either have the correct money for their own purchase or that they are aware that their change is to be taken home.

Nut Free Zones All P-4 classrooms are NUT FREE zones. This means that no raw nuts or processed nuts such as 'Nutella' are permitted in lunchboxes. Please check all muesli bars to ensure they do not contain nuts. If you are unsure about an item, please ask your classroom teacher.





School Uniform Thank you everyone for the excellent effort in ensuring your child is dressed in the complete school uniform. Please continue to support us by using the correct coloured socks and hair ties. Girls are required to have their hair, if shoulder length or beyond, tied back and boys are also to have their hair tied back if their fringe is long enough to cover their face. 



Broadford, Pyalong, Kilmore, St Pats Kilmore, Wandong.


