Our Mercy Spirit - Thankyou Catherine! A wonderful day it was

(Monday 12 August) organised by Mrs Evans and Mrs Gough. Did you know...Catherine McAuley could have been a millionaire living a very luxurious life but she decided to put the money into educating young women and helping the poor. She opened The House of Mercy in Baggot Street Dublin much to the annoyance of wealthy local residents. Catherine lived in a time when Irish Catholics were under English penal laws and banned from membership in the Irish Parliament; could not

own a horse over 5 pound; Catholic Churches had to be built out of wood and were not to be seen from a main road. Oppression can only last for so long, yet it was the Catherine McAuley's of this world who soldiered on even through absolute despair.



**2020 Enrolments** There will be an enrolment increase in the student population for 2020. At present our College is planning for 175 secondary and 276 primary students with an overall increase of 51 students. There will be two Prep classes next year and planning is underway for the extra classrooms required across P-10. A reminder if you know a family who would not normally catch up on St Mary's College news and who are considering enrolment please advise them to contact the College Office asap.

**St Mary's College Catholic Care Psychologist** As from next week St Mary's will have a Catholic Care psychologist (welcome Peter Folidis) at the school from Friday 16 August, one day a week for the remainder of 2019. Peter works in other Catholic schools and will be at St Mary's as from next Wednesday 21 August. As from 2020 our College will have a Catholic Care psychologist for 3-4 days a week. This appointment is a first for St Mary's and we know it is needed and will be valued by students, parents and staff. Catholic Care Melbourne provide psychologists for



more than 75 Melbourne Archdiocesan Catholic Schools and we look forward to the support that this arrangement will offer our College families. In time there will be more information for families (particularly in 2020) regarding the process and protocols for consultations. The comer room of the Mercy Centre is currently being refurnished to become *Mercy 1* - *The Psychologist Room*.

- Since the **parish car park** was closed in Term One due to obvious safety reasons it is worth reflecting on what has happened since that time.

**Master Plan and State Government Grant** The College community will soon be informed of a recent meeting that was held to consider the current Master Plan and the State Government grant. The meeting was valuable and constructive as a lead into setting future directions for St Mary's College.

### Student Wellbeing

from the Deputy Principal ...

At St Mary's College we encourage all students to be inclusive and to be considerate and respectful of one another with both voice and actions. The Wellbeing team does a large amount of research and reading to ensure we are continually exploring proactive strategies to ensure all our students continue to feel

supported and valued within our College. We have been a Positive Behaviour school for many years and we all take pride in knowing our College TAG – Show Respect, Act Justly and Do Your Best. This approach focuses on Restorative Practices and engaging the students to take greater ownership of their behaviours and choices.

Over the coming few weeks, all classes will revisit our TAG and continue to strengthen how we live this out in our everyday interactions with one another.

The staff will revisit our TAG Rubric, with the students, who originally came up with the idea, during our Pastoral Care sessions. The rubric outlines how the College TAG looks and sounds like within a classroom, yard, canteen, corridor, bus stop and other areas within the school context.
