

Fencing the College Boundary The Honorable Melissa Horne, Minister for Ports and Freights and Public Transport and the Honorable Jaclyn Symes Member for Northern Victoria, Minister for Agriculture, Regional Development and Resources and Deputy Leader of the Legislative Council, visited St Mary's on Monday 18 November to announce funding support to install a fence along the railway line boundary of the College. St Mary's is very thankful of the State Government and grateful for the behind the scenes work of Jaclyn Symes Office in supporting our cause to fence our south east boundary. Fencing the College boundary will provide a safer environment for the students and enable maintenance on the College boundary to be more accessible. The College is also in negotiations with Middy's to share the cost of a fence along the McIntyre Street boundary. The land surrounding the

College has been surveyed to ensure correct boundary borders. Once completed the only section of College boundary to be fenced is the Whiteheads Creek boundary. Fencing this boundary may require a decision to be made on the future of a Seymour levee bank.

Staff Appointments After panel interviews last week, we welcome in 2020 Ed Harding; Zoe Davies and Aleena Arnold to St Mary's into primary classes. Ed hails from a farming family near Finley; Zoe is on staff at St Mary's and taught in Queensland and the Northern Territory. Aleena lives at Puckapunyal after experiencing schools in Northern Territory and South Australia. We welcome all three to St Mary's in 2020 and look forward to their contribution to the learning outcomes of the students and to the College community.

Having discussed the Marian at Leadership meetings and consulted with members of the Office team, with various staff and parents, a fortnightly



Have we been inclusive? Are we empathetic? Have we shown forgiveness? Forgiveness is about letting things go ...

Mahatma Gandhi said, "The weak can never forgive. <u>Forgiveness</u> is the attribute of the strong." This rings true. It's not always easy to move beyond hurtful feelings when someone has wronged you. But, research shows practicing forgiveness has many benefits.

With the weather warming up considerably in next few weeks left of school, I would like to remind both the students and parents of a couple of protocols.



Snake Policy What to do when there is a snake sighting...

In the event of a snake sighting on or near the College grounds, ALL STUDENTS need to follow these protocols:

Move away from the snake immediately and find the nearest teacher. If you cannot see a teacher go to the office and tell them.

Do not approach, scare or throw things at the snake or get in the path of the snake.

Tell other students who are nearby to move away from the area.

SunSmart Policy It is crucial that ALL students F-10 wear their broad brimmed hats that protect them as well as being fully hydrated with water throughout the day. Please ensure your child also has applied sunscreen in the morning before coming to school and have some in their bag to reapply. Students are kept INDOORS on extremely hot days, and we follow similar procedures to wet weather days.

Road Safety - Drop off and Pick up times A reminder that the parish carpark is not to be used for school drop off or pick up.

School Crossings –It is highly recommended that all students use the crossings on Crawford and High streets, unless they are accompanied by an adult.

High Street Parking - When parking on High street in the angle parking and reversing out, please be mindful of oncoming traffic and cars coming in to park and abide by applicable road rules.

Mobile Phones We have had a few incidents where students have misused our trust in them to do the right thing and leave their phones locked away in their lockers. They have been using them during break times and in particular the toilets and material is appearing out in social media world. Please discuss this with your secondary age child and that this is not permitted and their phone will be confiscated each morning whilst at school and returned at the end of the day. Please continue to encourage your child to make the right choices and supporting the College in the protocols and expectations.

Uniform As we near the end of the school year, there may be some items that need replacing, which we understand, however, we still require students to come in full school uniform till end of the year. Thank you for your ongoing support with this.

As we come to the end of week 7, I encourage you to keep your child on task and attending EVERY DAY as we know each day counts. It is an exciting time of the year when we have transition and Orientation Day coming up and planning for 2020.

from the Deputy Principal ...

Students in our primary years have much work still to come to cover the Curriculum expectations for the year. Our Year 9 and 10 students will be sitting exams next week. The timing of this is to ensure that marking can be completed by the reporting deadlines.

Students in years 7-9 two weeks left to manage yourselves and your learning, and to enjoy your end of year celebration activity.

Transition for students in years F-7 (2020) is provided as these students experience the biggest changes to their schooling. We have already held 2 sessions with another to come and then the Orientation Day in December.
