Holy Week is the great week of our Catholic Faith. Palm Sunday begins the week followed by the Archdiocesan Chrism Mass to bless the Oils used in the Sacraments for the new liturgical year. The Mass of The Last Supper on Thursday evening leads into the Passion of Christ. Good Friday is the solemn service when the Gospel of St John is read, the Passion of Christ – his arrest, trial and crucifixion

followed by the light of the new dawn that shines brightly on *Easter Sunday*. Christians believe in the fullness of the resurrection, when Christ rose from the dead *on the third day*. I am thinking of Fr Eugene as I type this introduction. Holy Week is a time where the sacredness of ritual led by our parish priest inspires the hearts and minds of others to reflect on the fragility of humanity and the joy of our faith. May we keep Fr Eugene in our prayers as we do for each other within our St Mary's College community over the Easter weekend and during the long journey of Covid 19.

If ever there is a time where faith is important in the streets, in the home and indeed in our hospitals it is now. It can be so easily forgotten that Jesus was as human as he was divine. Jesus held all the human emotions that we carry. He laughed; He cried and He certainly showed times of frustration. He felt the pain of loss and the sadness when let down. Jesus was human. The man, the son was dearly and proudly loved by his father and mother. Any parent can relate to that same love that Joseph and Mary had for their child.

Regardless of one's denomination, personal beliefs or any other hurdles, Holy Week is the 'Great Week' for Christians.
