

Year Ten Graduation

Student Teacher Placement



We really learned a lot from Mrs Hooper, and then Felix Muscovic accepted the challenge to debate Mrs Hooper on the topic 'Monarchy or Democracy?'

With very minimal preparation time (about 2 minutes!!) they engaged in short but wonderful debate.

Congratulations to Felix who did such an amazing job for the side of the Monarchy- we would like another debate very soon!

We also had the opportunity to work with the Yr. 9 Faith Education class. They had been working on an Inquiry task about Catholic Social Teaching.

It was great to hear what they had been investigating and how we could make links in our own class. All students worked really well together

Year 7 English

This term Year 7 English classes have been studying Picture Stories. They have looked at picture stories for young children, teenagers and adults and had the opportunity to share one of their favourites with 1/2D.
