

#### The Reason for the Season

'When Mary and Joseph arrived in Bethlehem there was no room for them at the inn, they were forced to find lodging elsewhere, probably in a cave where animals were staying. When Jesus was born, Mary would not have wanted to lay her infant on the hard,

Instead, she had to make do with what was available and the manger proved to be a convenient alternative: the hay was soft, the box was up and off the ground, and the sides tall enough to keep her child safely inside.' They went in haste and found the child in the feeding trough and they feasted their eyes on him (Lk 2:16).

In 2021 we will look further to providing families with more opportunities

to be offered the sacramental program, especially through baptism as parents at enrolment interviews recognise the importance of the Colleges holistic belief and sacramental pathway for their children.

#### Positions of Leadership Renewal

As has been mentioned in previous Marian's the College Review was held last year as all Catholic School's undergo a cyclical review program within the model of the Catholic Education Melbourne (CEM) School Improvement Framework (SIF). The College leadership structure required renewal and this began in the latter part of 2019 and was completed by the end of Term Three 2020. Leadership positions were advertised with a three-year appointment in line with the Strategic Plan. In February of this year the area of Learning Diversity was reviewed by Catholic Education Melbourne. This review was important to ensure the College continues with best practice in line with CEM expectations and Federal Government NCCD protocols.

The VIT/Coaching and Parent Engagement Coordinator are new positions of responsibility and will support both staff development and parent engagement.

#### **Primary Learning Centre**

In 2019 the College began working with ROAM architects and Stephanie Wood from CEM to fulfil State government requirements for the 2018 State Election Grant of 2018 (\$1.4 million). One of the main criteria of the grant was to ensure the project is completed by the end of 2021. This is a significant boost for our College and the Primary Learning Centre will be an excellent educational learning environment. Moretto Building Pty Ltd of Shepparton were the successful tenders and will begin site works in January 2021. The College thanks Fr Ashkar and the parish community for working with the College to move the car park to the southern side of the Church. The car park is an excellent site for construction and will save on management and groundworks costs.

#### **Mercy Centre**

The Chapel is undergoing refurbishment. The chapel will be a gathering place for liturgy, reflective opportunities and small group meetings. Sr Sylvia Williams RSM a former principal of Sacred Heart College Seymour visited the College to offer her advice on the chapel. Former St Mary's teacher Mr Brian O'Dwyer will donate his time to build a portable altar. How wonderful it will be to return the College Chapel to the College community. The former Admin Office in the Mercy Centre will become a flexible meeting room. Shearer Construction are completing these works.

#### **Post Graduate Studies**

Congratulations to Ms Davies (Grad Cert Education Literacy Intervention); Mrs Pearce and Ms Hurst (Masters Allied School Psychology) and Mr Krammer (Masters in Religious Education or Theology) on being accepted into these 2021 courses that are co-sponsored by CEM; Australian Catholic University and the College.

#### House (Mentor) Groups

St Mary's secondary students will begin an exciting Pastoral program in 2021 with House Mentors. House Mentors is a proven model used extensively in many Catholic Secondary schools. The model is based on an integrated approach with families in the same Mentor group and students from across 7-10 in the same House group. A prime strength of the House Mentor system is to provide in-service for the Year 10 students to become peer leaders promoting a sense of belonging for students to their Mentor group and House. Mrs Moore, the 2021 Director of Wellbeing is researching primary and secondary Positive Behaviour programs currently in use in Australian Catholic schools to implement a St Mary's program from F-10 inclusive of age-appropriate activities.

#### St Mary's Child and e-Safety Committee

In 2021 this committee will be formed and consist of membership from staff, student and parent representatives. The Police Youth Liaison Officer has also been invited to join the committee to meet each term to discuss programs and education for our students and to consider parent education on e-Safety.

Elizabeth began at St Mary's in 2016 and her impressive teaching skills, love of the students and welcoming smile in a caring classroom atmosphere are all obvious to colleagues and parents. 

The Victorian Government is introducing a container deposit scheme (CDS) to increase beverage container recycling and reduce litter in Victoria.

A container deposit scheme works by applying a small deposit to beverages sold to consumers which covers the cost of recycling. When the empty beverage containers – such as those in plastic, glass bottles and aluminium cans, are returned to a refund collection point, a cash refund can be collected for each container returned.

This consultation seeks your views on the proposed design for Victoria's container deposit scheme and how it should operate. Key design choices such as how the deposit is received, types of eligible containers and types of refund collection infrastructure will all influence your experience with the CDS and how much you'll want to use it. This is your opportunity to have your say, so that our scheme best suits Victoria's needs.
