During our conversation the boy said, *“Mr Smith, I wish my parents would say no to me.”* What is tough love? Perhaps the following Steve Biddulph dot points might be a reasonable summary or definition:

Not giving in to keep the peace.

Accepting there are times when a teenager needs to be given a reality check.

Valuing/making family time.

Staying strong to your decisions.

Have boundaries, expectations and nurture resilience.

Love that is unconditional, inappropriate behaviours that are not.

Use the word NO.

Reading Buddies

On Friday afternoon the first buddy reading session was run. These sessions will be conducted fortnightly on Friday afternoon during the Pastoral Care session and will involve students from Secondary House Mentor Groups being buddied with a primary student. The program has been implemented to support the wellbeing of students and address one of the focuses of the College's strategic intent of improving reading outcomes for all students.

Pairing students with an older buddy contributes to the younger students feeling safe, valued and connected to their school. Our secondary students are given the opportunity and responsibility to demonstrate positive behaviour and valuable social skills to their buddy.

Both the secondary student and their primary buddy will be given the opportunity to read on occasions. Younger students grow as readers when they hear more experienced readers model fluent reading.

Mrs Kerrie Pearce (Primary Literacy Leader) visited all secondary classrooms and gave the students advice, instructions and outlined expectations when listening to younger students read. Mrs Pearce advised the secondary students to help their buddy when it is needed. She also encouraged the older students to ask questions to check for understanding. Example questions included,

- "What just happened?"
- "Why do you think that happened?"
- "What will happen next?"

The smiles and engagement displayed by both younger and older students indicated that this program will be of huge value to the students and the school.

We have found these discussions to be invaluable in getting to know you and to establish a point of contact for more effective communication and support.

On Monday 15th February, parents of **Primary students** will receive an SMS to notify that Parent teacher bookings are open and can be made through your PAM account. This meeting with your child's class teacher is to begin the year by getting to know you and to discuss how your child has begun the year!

There are 2 choices of meeting.

The first day will be via the Google Meet platform. Teachers will be available online for these sessions.

The second date is for those who prefer face to face meetings on site.

Thursday 18th February between 3:30pm and 6:00pm

Bookings will be held via Google Meet. When you make the booking there is a link that you will open to connect to the teacher via your device at your booking time.

Monday 22nd February between 3:30pm and 6:00pm

Bookings will be for face-to-face meetings with the teacher to be held at School in your child's classroom.

If you have not yet set up your PAM account, please follow the instructions below.

SIMON is a Learning Management System used by the College that allows staff and students to interact with assessment materials, and to view daily communications, timetables and calendars.

The parent version of SIMON is the **Parent Access Module (PAM)**.

As a parent/guardian you are able to use PAM for the following:

- View a calendar of upcoming school events
- View your child's timetable and our bell times
- View your child's commendations
- View and reflect on completed student assessment tasks (Years 7-10)
- View your child's School Report
- Book Student/Parent/Teacher Interviews
- Report a daily student absence to the school

Accounts



CAMPS SPORTS EXCURSION FUND CSEF

The Victorian Government provides this fund to assist eligible families with the costs of camps, sports and excursions.

To be eligible for the fund, a parent of a student attending a Victorian school must be the holder of an eligible Centrelink Health Care card, Veterans Affairs Card or Pensioner Concession card as at the first day of Term One or Term Two.

The amounts payable are \$125 for a primary student and \$225 for a secondary student. The funds are received at the College and go directly towards the payment of the excursion/camp levy.

We ask that parents submit their application to the school by 22nd February. However, parents who received CSEF at the school in 2020 do not need to complete an application form in 2020, providing there has been no change in their family circumstances. Application forms are available at the College office and a form is also available with this newsletter. Please contact Stacia Read at the College if you have any questions regarding the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund.

CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE

This allowance is payable to those families who reside more than 4.8 kms from the College or nearest free bus service. Families who wish to claim this allowance for the first time are asked to contact the College office for an application form. Those families who received Conveyance Allowance last year need not re-apply. Please note, however, that a new form must be completed if there has been a change of address or if there has been a change in circumstances which may affect the payment of this allowance. Please return applications to the College by 1st March. Thank you.

From the Shire

Mitchell Shire School Road Safety

A message from your Shire Office:

Mitchell Shire Council Officers would prefer not to issue parking fines around our school zones. We would prefer that everyone park safely. The Shire encourages parents and guardians to work into their busy schedules "time" to ensure that they park appropriately around our schools across the Shire. There are limited parking options around our school zones during busy peak periods and as a result parking close or near the school can be difficult and frustrating. We encourage parents to walk children to school or drop children off near the school so they can walk. It is important that all school children, parents and guardians utilise school crossings and walk the extra distance instead of crossing the road in an area that is otherwise unsafe to do so. Please be aware that:

- 1. Children have very poor road sense and peripheral vision and may not see danger approaching,**
- 2. Children's ability to acknowledge distances is not very advanced.**

We are required to park legally around school zones to ensure the safety of all school children and road users. Everyone has a responsibility to ensure the safety of all school children around school zones at all times. Mitchell Shire Local Laws Officers are very proactive around our school zones when it comes to parking.
