It may seem like light years ago but back in March 2021 we had 450 family members visit St Mary's for the Celebration of Learning Evening. It was a great night and showed a wonderful sense of connection between home and the College. Those times will return.

2022 College Theme "Act with courage, be strong in your faith."



Thank you to Ms Ally (Yardley) from the Creative Arts team. Ms Ally was invited to create the image for the 2022 theme and did not disappoint. The following is Ms Ally's description of her work: "When asked to paint the College painting for 2022, with our school theme in mind, 'Act with courage, be strong in your faith' I immediately thought of Christ and the courageous sacrifice he made. Although not visible there are two paintings of Christ. One that can be felt and one that can be seen.... not unlike courage itself. The canvas is circular. The circle is a universal symbol with extensive meaning. It represents the notions of totality, wholeness, original perfection, the self, the infinite, eternity, timelessness, all cyclic movement, God ('God is a circle whose centre is everywhere and whose circumference is nowhere' (Hermes Trismegistus). The painting is black and white, for the focus is on the message of courage.... "Take chances, make mistakes. That's how you grow. Pain nourishes your courage. Post COVID-19 2022 Support

This support is focused on improving educational outcomes for students; being mindful of cost for families and in support of learning. This support includes:

- College fees will not increase overall in 2022 as is the case in most Archdiocesan Schools. There will be a \$50
 Capital Levy per family, which will contribute to the College's Masterplan infrastructure and capital expenses.
 The Masterplan outlines the College's endeavours for an F-12 pathway.
- Mrs Louise Reed an experienced literacy intervention teacher will teach across primary and secondary focusing specifically on the Macquarie University Multlit programs.
- Tutor support will continue in 2022 with support in numeracy intervention.
- Mr Keating will return to part time teaching focusing on Mathematics extension.
- Mrs Buhler will move to the Teacher Librarians role to highlight the importance of students' connection to the library and digital education.
- An extra class has been created in upper primary, Year 5 two classes and Year 6 two classes.
- Class sizes across the College are smaller than other Catholic schools of the same size.
- Another Primary Coordinators position has been introduced. Mr Ed Harding will cordinate Years 3-6 and Mrs Spencer F-2.
- State Goverment sponsored Camps. More detail is yet to be released.

MulitLit

The College is in its infancy with using the Maquarie University program. The improvement from pre test data to post test data for many students has been incredible and there is no doubt that Multilit will provide significant support as we develop the Mini and MacLit parts of the program from Year 3 upward for students who need this intervention support.

Primary Learning Centre (PLC)

F-2 classes and staff will begin in their new home from the beginning of the 2022 College year. Like all new buildings there will still be some minor works to be completed, especially in the current climate with delays on supplies. A date will be set aside to show families and parishioners through the learning centre. The College has received a \$25000 grant to add a shade shelter and there will be landscaping works completed between the peppercorn trees and the PLC's cement pathway. Staff, the College Advisory Council and the P&F Executive will tour the building tomorrow morning.

Pathway Committee

The committee has been consultative; proactive; strategic; diligent and professional in writing a submission to research the desire to return St Mary's to Year 12. Our submission will be officially sent to MACS in February. Families will be updated as soon as the MACS Executive have reveiwed the submission. The submission includes: needs and viability data collection; Mitchell Shire Community Plan 2020; Literature Review – Continuity of Education; Mitchel Shire and Key Stakeholder Consultations; MACs Enrolments Reports; St Mary's Yr6-7 Progression Rates; Rural Schools Consultations; Curriculum Development and Master Planning; Parish Consultation and Parent Survey Findings. There is also a 5 year financial plan conducted by the MACs Finance team. The submission is lengthy and covers all aspects of MACs research requirements.



Abdominal pain

There have been a lot of students come to see me lately with abdominal pain. Abdominal pain is pain or cramping anywhere in the abdomen (tummy, belly or stomach). Children often complain of abdominal pain and it is one of the most common reasons children see a doctor.

There are many things that can cause abdominal pain.

- Bowel (gut) problems such as constipation or irritable bowel.
- Infections such as gastroenteritis (which causes vomiting and diarrhoea/runny poo.
- Problems that may require surgery such as appendicitis or a bowel obstruction.
- Period pain.
- Food related too much food, food poisoning or food allergies and intolerances.
- Some children get abdominal pain as a result of stress or anxiety.
- Sometimes there is no identifiable cause for the abdominal pain.

The causes of abdominal pain can be hard to determine. Sometimes the cause becomes more obvious with time, and it is important to discuss your child's abdominal pain with your GP so they can work out the best treatment.

Here are some general ways to ease your child's pain:

- Encourage and help your child drink their usual amount of fluids. Getting your child to drink is important as it prevents dehydration.
- Encourage sitting on the toilet.
- Increase their fibre intake, to help keep them regular.
- If your child is nauseous, let them eat what they want or offer bland foods such as crackers, rice, bananas or toast.
- Give pain relief if your child is in pain.

If your child's pain or abdominal problems persist for more than 24 hours, or you are worried about your child, please take them to the GP and remember your child can only come to school 24 hours **after** their last vomit or loose bowel movement.



There is no need to return any forms or money to school.


Unique image codes will be issued to all students on/after photo day so families can register online to view images when they become available in the webshop.
