They have already added to the positive energy and our students will benefit in their learning and from the pastoral support they will receive. Over this term and beginning with the next Marian, each new staff member will be highlighted so families get to know something of about our new colleagues.

The two staff days leading up to the new College year were excellent in the outcomes that were achieved:

- 1. F-2, 3-6 and 7-10 staff have developed ROUTINES that will be consistently applied by all staff in and outside of the classroom. These routines link to the Positive Behaviour for Learning program (PBL) the College has engaged with the MACS Wellbeing team. The students will benefit from this consistency of practice.
- 2. Each classroom F-10 will have on the whiteboard, lesson Learning Intentions (LI) and Success Criteria (SC). Both will provide students with clarity and use a similar language from classroom to classroom giving direction to learning with a common curriculum language and purpose.

The updated website will be launched in Week 2 of Term 2. It is important for the website to be current and provide new prospective families with a good overview of St Mary's College.

### F-12 Pathway Committee

The submission requesting MACS in principle support to return to Year 12 will be submitted later this month and accompanied with a video presentation. Former student Matthew Giannarelli will produce a video to accompany the submission. Parents will be updated on the submissions progress and timelines.

### **Primary Learning Centre**

How good is that building! We look forward to the day when the PLC is open for parents and parishioners to walk through – this will happen after Week 4. Like all new buildings there are minor defects that are being addressed along with fencing and signage to complete.

### The Oval and Maintenance

Students have commented on the oval – no weeds, the grass is spreading and the sprinkler system once thought to be beyond repair is working. Nick Liddell has certainly hit the ground running and is keen to have the sprinkler system back in automatic timer mode. The College maintenance team will also maintain the parish grounds around the presbytery, hall and Church. With the aging parish population, it is a huge job to keep the grounds trimmed and well presented. Work will be completed this year with a fence bordering the creek side of the College perimeter.

#### First 4 Weeks

Covid-19 has a habit of hanging around. Sensibly, the College will not have major events in the first 4 weeks of term. The Opening Mass will be postponed and the Swimming Carnival will only include swimmers vying for Age Champions. From this group will come representative selection for District, Regional and State Championships if they are held.



### **College Communications**

The Marian to begin with, will be published every Week B – fortnightly. Parents will be surveyed this term on College Communications in the lead up to the website release in Term 2.

Welcome to our new local, regional and Defence Force families. St Mary's is a special College and we look forward to your journey with us.

# Deputy Principal Operations

### Welcome to the 2022 school year

There is a sense of excitement and optimism amongst College staff and students.

Why wouldn't there be? We have:

- a new Primary Learning Centre (PLC)
- new colleagues
- new students
- and drawing near is the submission date for the F-12 Pathway proposal, 'Spiritu Ducti'.

The following article outlines important communication and operational processes that are in place at the College. To ensure consistency in our understanding and practises it is beneficial to remind the College Community of these operational processes at the beginning of the year. I hope you find this information useful and please do not hesitate to contact the Office or the appropriate staff member if you have any queries.

### **Rapid Antigen Tests**

Please refer to previous email communication from College Principal, Mr Wayne Smith titled 'Covid 19 and Rapid Testing'. Students are encouraged to do Rapid Antigen Tests twice a week for the first 4 weeks of Term 1. Nurse Brooke provided further instructions with the distribution of tests.

#### Marian

The College Newsletter, the Marian, is the official channel of communication to parents/guardians and members of the College community. The Marian is published fortnightly on a Friday. When the newsletter is ready for viewing an email containing a direct link is sent to parents. Parents can also access the Marian via the College Website. A hardcopy of the Marian can be collected from the College office for those who prefer a hard copy.

### Weekly Emails – Primary

Every Sunday throughout the term, families of primary aged students will receive a weekly email from their child's classroom teacher. This weekly email will contain reminders, event information, a weekly learning overview along with dates to remember that are specific to your child's class.

### **PAM – Parent Access Module**

St Mary's College staff and students use a learning management software called SIMON. PAM (the Parent Access Module) is linked to SIMON and enables parents to access the latest details regarding their child's progress. After logging into the site all parents can:

- View the College calendar.
- Access the Marian newsletter.
- See attendance records for their child and report student absence.
- View your child's timetable.
- View your child's assessment reports.



In addition, parents of secondary aged students can:

- Check if homework tasks have been set and completed.
- See results for assessment tasks and the feedback given.

Parents can access PAM by clicking on the PAM logo in the header of the College website.

The username for PAM is your email address. If you have forgotten your password, please use the reset password option.

### **SIMON Medical**

The College no longer uses Operoo, we are now using SIMON to track student medical details and request parental permission for excursions. Please ensure you update your child/s medical profile using the PAM portal.

#### Medication

If a student requires prescription medication throughout the day, they will be sent to the College Nurse (Brooke). Brooke will administer medication as advised by a medical professional. It is important that:

- medication is stored at the Health Centre
- parents/carers have completed and signed a Medical Authority Form
- medication is clearly labelled with a pharmacy label, identifying the child's name and dosage information relating to time and amount
- all prescription medication must come in its original packaging from the pharmacists with expiry dates visible

If a student requires over the counter medication throughout the day, please ensure both the class teacher and Nurse Brooke are informed of the dosage information relating to time and amount. For ongoing over the counter medication use, parents/carers will also need to complete and sign a Medical Authority Form.

Paracetamol consent on PAM will be respected, Brooke will contact parents prior to administering when needed.

Please be advised that when selecting 'yes' to **anaphylaxis**, **allergy** or **asthma** on your child's SIMON medical details, you must upload an up-to-date action plan, completed by the student's medical practitioner. Any information from your child's GP or Paediatrician is greatly appreciated regarding any medical diagnosis. You are also required to supply the Health Centre with any necessary medication(s) to treat these medical conditions e.g: EpiPen, Ventolin & spacer, antihistamine, Nurofen etc.

### **House Mentor Teacher & Class Teacher**

In 2021, St Mary's College introduced Secondary House Mentor Groups. The House Mentor Group consists of students from the same House (Padua or McAuley) and from the various year levels meeting in the one space with a House Mentor Teacher. Siblings are in the same House Mentor Group. Where possible students will have the same Mentor Teacher for their entire secondary education at the College. This will enable families to form a strong relationship with the House Mentor Teacher and every individual student is well known and connected to the College. If you wish to discuss your child's progress and/or wellbeing the first point of call is your child's Class Teacher (Primary) and House Mentor Teacher (Secondary).

### **Phone Calls and Voice Messages**

Parents are welcome to phone the College Office to speak to staff. Before school, staff are busy preparing for the day ahead and they may be unavailable to take phone calls. Staff are involved in morning meetings before school on Monday and Wednesday. If staff are unavailable to take your call you will be transferred to their voice mail and invited to leave a message.

#### **Staff Emails**

Schools are busy places and it can be difficult to reach teaching staff by phone throughout the day. We encourage communication via email. Staff are then able to follow up and if necessary, engage in a phone conversation with you at time when they aren't in the classroom. Staff will endeavour to respond to any communication within 48 hours of contact being made.

#### **College Entrance**

Students are encouraged to enter the College grounds through the gate on High Street or by using the walkway from the bus stop off McIntyre Street.

#### **Bus Travel**

The identity of St Mary's as a regional College is developing and as such, we have students travelling from various surrounding towns to attend our school. Staff on bus duty will carry with them information regarding the bus routes taken by our students. This will help to ensure our younger students board the correct bus if they experience any confusion. If a student misses their bus, staff on duty will direct them to the College Office and Office staff will contact parents. When the teachers finish bus duty they will ensure the child has arrived at the Office and that contact has been made with parents.

It is important that both students and parents/guardians are familiar with the expectations of students travelling on buses. The College Behaviour Management Policy states the following with regard to Bus Behaviour.

Students who use bus travel to and from St Mary's College are reminded of safe behaviours. Bus drivers have a difficult role ensuring they deliver their passengers safely. If home contact is required, the College is very supportive of the driver's role and responsibility. The driver's concentration on the road is paramount and to be respected at all times by every student. At the beginning of each year parents receive a reminder of College expectations for bus travel.

The College is guided by the Victorian Department of Education and Training School Bus Program protocols for any student's behaviour requiring further intervention. Parents inform the Coordinators - Mrs Anne Spencer F-2, Ed Harding 3-6 or Mrs Mary Tampion 7-10 of a bus incident. If the behaviour of a student is not appropriate the 1-4 response may be required:

- 1. First offence verbal warning to student.
- 2. Second offence written warning to parent/guardian.
- 3. Third offence one-week suspension of student from school bus travel.
- 4. Fourth offence the student may not be allowed to travel on the school bus for the remainder of the year. (Requires MACS consultation).

### **Contacting Students**

If throughout the day you need to contact your child this should be done through the College Office. Parents are asked to refrain from contacting students on their mobile phone, smart watches or via email during the school day.

#### **Mobile Phones**

Mobile phones are the responsibility of the students and students are advised to keep them secured safely in their locker. Parents of primary aged students with smart watch devices are asked to ensure that the device is on a parental lock or an inactive mode, such as aeroplane mode, between the hours of 8:30am and 3:15pm.

### **Late Arrival and Leave Passes**

In the case of an emergency, it is important that all students in attendance on College grounds are accounted for. It is important that students who arrive at school after 8.45am sign in at the Office before going to their classroom. Similarly, if students leave the College prior to 3.15pm parents must collect their child from the College Office and sign them out.

#### **Student Absentee**

Parents are asked to notify the College if their child is absent for any reason. Notification can be given by ringing the College Office directly in the morning and following the phone prompts for absentees or by using PAM and clicking on the Parent Notified Absences Tab. Absences can only be added using PAM up until 11am on the day of the absence. Parents receive notification via text message at 9:30am if students are absent and the office has not received notification.

### **Lunch Orders**

Lunch orders are written on a brown paper bag or a piece of paper in a snap lock bag with money enclosed. A price list will be emailed to families, it is also available on the college website and is displayed on the canteen windows.

In primary students place their order in the lunch tub as they enter the classroom of a morning. These are brought to the canteen in the morning by a class monitor as directed by the class teacher. The class monitors collect the lunch tub from the canteen at 1:15pm (Year F-4) and 1:20pm (Year 5& 6) and the class teacher distributes the food.

Secondary students are asked to deliver their order to the canteen before morning House Mentor Group. Students collect their lunch from the canteen once the lunch bell sounds at 1:25pm.

Please Note: Until further notice the College Canteen will be open for lunch orders only, no counter sales.

### **Birthday Cakes**

We encourage teachers and students to celebrate special occasions as it develops relationships and morale within the classroom. If you wish for your child to share the celebration of their birthday with a cake, we ask that you provide individual cupcakes and the classroom teacher with a list of ingredients. This allows staff to monitor the risk to students with specific allergies. A conversation with the classroom teacher in advance allows them to contact parents of any students with allergies so that the child's parents can provide an alternative treat in this situation.





Once you have selected your child you will be able to view details such as:


Student timetable – provides details of each class your child will attend over the 2-week timetable cycle.

Learning Task - used mainly in the Secondary classes. You can view current active tasks and any overdue tasks.


### Contacting your child's teacher

Email Staff is used to contact your child's teachers. This is useful to inform the teacher of any issues such as *Out of Uniform*, pastoral concerns, or other educational matters.




### Library

### **Library Services**

- o The library is open from 8:25am Before School for Book Return and Borrowing.
- Lunchtime there will be a choice of scheduled activities and self-directed activities. Scheduled activities will be: Monday Book Club. Wednesday Technology Challenges. Thursday Maths Strategy Games.
- o There is a laptop recharging station for students to use during lunchtime if their laptop is at 20% or less.
- o To support our strategic intent of improved reading outcomes all classes from F-10 have a booking time with their teacher once a fortnight. F-6 with their class teacher and 7-10 English classes. This will ensure at least one point of contact in order to read and exchange books.



### **Secondary School Immunisation Program**

The secondary school immunisation program offers free vaccines provided by the National Immunisation Program each year to students in Year 7 and Year 10. The local council immunisation service visits the school to provide the vaccination program.

### Look out for the information and consent form

Parents/guardians of students in Year 7 and Year 10 should look out for the vaccine information and consent form coming home from school with your child. You need to read the information, complete, and return the consent form. If you choose not to consent for your child to be vaccinated as part of the school-based immunisation program, you also need to return the consent form.

### Students who missed school vaccines due to COVID-19

Some students now in Year 8 and Year 11 may need to complete their vaccine program this year to catch-up the missed vaccines. The local council immunisation service will advise parents/guardians and work with the school to deliver any catch-up vaccines due to students. The consent that you provided last year for the school-based immunisation program remains valid and you do not need to complete another consent form.

□ Please note if you consent for your child to be immunised for their Year 7 or Year 10 immunisation but then obtain this immunisation elsewhere, you must notify the Mitchell Shire Immunisation Team on 5734.6355 or email to <a href="mailto:immunisation@mitchellshire.vic.gov.au">immunisation@mitchellshire.vic.gov.au</a> advising your child's name and school, to ensure your child has completed all required vaccinations. Please make sure your immunisation provider has reported the vaccination to the Australian Immunisation Register if received elsewhere.
