I have no doubt that many workplaces outside of the health and education sectors are also struggling with Covid-19 and now the flu season is hitting with a vengeance. The past two years has been demanding. We currently have staff on leave due to Covid, the flu virus and or with other related health issues. Yet the collegiality and willingness of staff to assist is of no surprise at St Mary's. Our staff support each other and together we look after the village. Our daily operations at present are symbolic of the story of the loaves and fishes as we keep classes intact. The reality for education across Australia is that there are very few casual relief teachers around - the days of automatically replacing a teacher on leave are long gone. Some schools since the beginning of the 2022 are keeping a year level at home either weekly or fortnightly due to teacher shortage. St Mary's has not had to resort to such a dire measure and it is our best intention not to do so.

The students were in charge of all preparations and so well prepared by Miss Jade and Mrs Evans. The children spoke with such confidence – did not miss a beat! F-12 Pathway- College Planning Day

With the Melbourne Archdiocese of Catholic Schools (MACS) announcement of St Mary's College moving to Year 11 in 2024 and Year 12 in 2025, the College has much planning and preparation to undertake to ensure all is operational on day one of 2024.

Last Friday the College held an initial planning day, facilitated by Mr Christopher Bence (MACS Regional Leadership Consultant), Mrs Snjezana Singh (MACS Learning Consultant School Effectiveness Northern Region) and assisted by Mrs Jeannette Seguel (MACS Learning Consultant, Mathematics School Support).

The planning day was the beginning of the next phase of the journey for the College. The College staff were joined by the Northern Region MACS Manager Mr John Mills, Mr Sebastian Russell a representative from the MACS Planning and Infrastructure team, College Advisory Council members, P&F Association members and invited parents of our current student community.

The participants took part in a number of group sessions which looked at the following discussion points:

Interaction - using McKinsey's 7-S framework

Day One 2024 - How do we ensure that every student in the whole College is in the right place at the right time and knows where to go next?

Renewal – Domain (Subject Area) and Primary Year level teams

What will it take from our domain and year level teams to be ready to go on Day 1, 2024? **Reflection**

What could get in the way of successful completion?

What could we do to minimise this impact?

Where to from here?

The next steps – A coordinated Strategic Plan and Timeline.

Masterplan presentation by ROAM Architects.

It was wonderful to see the College staff, MACS staff and College community representatives come together and positively participate and actively contribute to the sessions. The planning day and the contribution of all involved is invaluable to the planning process and moving the College forward to Year 12.

The vision of the F-12 Pathway Committee was **'Spiritu Ducti'** and we hold onto this vision, as we continue on this journey.

Spiritu Ducti – 'Motivated by the Spirit,' calls us to reflect on the remarkable life of Venerable Catherine McAuley and the Sisters of Mercy she founded who have such a special place in the history of St Mary's and the town of Seymour itself. Below is an interview with Indigenous footballer Daniel Wells from the Australian Catholics magazine.

The greatest reward



Indigenous footballer Daniel Wells has had a successful AFL career, but says the satisfaction he gets from football cannot compare to the deeper fulfillment he gets from his family and his faith.

Who inspires you?

My family - and that's not just my wife and little one - that includes my family back home, who worked really hard in the early days to help get me to where I am now. When it gets a bit tough I think of my family. As a kid, I looked up to Peter Matera, who played for the West Coast Eagles back in the 1990s. He was someone I copied and wanted to be like. But once you get in here, you have to land on your own feet and

start trying to find your own ways. I've been here 10 years now, so I'm always trying to keep in front of the game.

How does it feel knowing you are a source of inspiration to others?

I really enjoy helping out the young ones and just trying to fast track them, telling them all my little secrets, or the things I like to do. I think the best way you can influence or impact others is by example - train hard and do the right thing. I was very similar to those younger guys - I used to watch the older guys and see what they did and pretty much mimic them, so there's no doubt they're doing that to all the older guys here. So, we just make sure we train hard and carry ourselves with class and dignity. If we do that I think the boys can't go wrong.

What are you most grateful for in your life?

I'm grateful for my parents and for all they've done for me and my siblings. We had a tough upbringing - Mum and

Dad had to work hard to make ends meet and sometimes to put food on the table. I wouldn't change anything in my past, but when I look back and realise how difficult they had to do it - especially Mum - I think they're pretty amazing. Back then Mum would always say, 'there are a lot more people worse off than we are', so she always kept things in perspective. Hopefully that's something I continue to remember and do because, compared with what I had and what I've got now, it is two different worlds. I'll never forget where I came from and what I've been through; I'll always be grateful for what I now have.

You have a strong Catholic faith - why is this?

As a young kid, I've always felt a sense of protection. We didn't belong to any religion growing up but we did believe in God - we just didn't do anything about it. We didn't go to church or Mass or anything like that - we went to Sunday school but I think that was more for Mum and Dad to have the morning off. My first experience of the Catholic faith was through meeting my wife - so, she was the main influence for why I became Catholic. But now I personally feel very strongly about it. We've both grown in our faith and we've been on that spiritual journey together ever since we married and I became a Catholic. And now with the birth of Laudate - she's the apple of my eye - the responsibility is back on us to make sure we bring her up in a way that is satisfactory to God. We want to make sure we bring her up in the best way we can.

When I think about everything in my life, you can't even compare my faith and family to work - they're just not in the same league. I am extremely grateful that I'm playing footy and I'm grateful for the experiences it is providing me - it allows me to do things that I would never have thought possible - but finding out who I really am through my faith and through my family is way more important.

What is the best advice you have ever received?

Treat people the way you'd like to be treated - that's something I try to live by. That's just being kind, courteous and respectful. I think if you do that, you can't go wrong. I also think it's important to stay humble and to keep things simple - don't get caught up in too many things.

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

EDUCATION

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2021, you do not need to complete an application form in 2022 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments**; your child has started or changed schools in 2022 or you did not apply in 2021.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2022.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.






