The behaviour values will be branded and visible in the

classroom and around the College and on e-platforms such as the College website. Thank you to Mrs Moore who has a vision for a St Mary's model of Wellbeing that is not only best practice but will truly support the holistic needs of students, particularly for students who have more complex needs.

## Welcome Nurse Katherine

In developing the model of Wellbeing, Katherine Treble (College Nurse) on Fridays, has accepted a 3-day per week position at St Mary's. Katherine will continue to be the Health Centre Nurse each Friday, ensuring the centre has a registered nurse in residence 5 days a week. Katherine will work closely with the Wellbeing team on the other two days to set up an early intervention of support for students. St Mary's is blessed to have two nurses, Lisa Glover and Katherine who are not only wonderful in relational skills and knowledgeable but also have such a caring way with the students.

## **Creative Play**

ROAM architects have completed a creative play design area alongside the Primary Learning Centre. The F-2 staff have reviewed the design. Nick Liddell the College Maintenance Manager will oversee the works and landscaping quotes. The design will be published in the coming weeks.

## F-12 Planning

Simone McLaughlin the College VCE Coordinator begins on Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> August. A renewal of Office duties is underway to ensure processes are in place for the future needs when Year 11 begins. Staffing for 2023 is also underway, as we are conscious of the decline in the teaching workforce across Australia. ## **Bus Stop Safety**

## **Puckapunyal Careers Visit**

On Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> of July a small group of Year 9 students and I travelled to Puckapunyal Military Area for a tour of the various departments contracted by Ventia. Ventia, one of the largest essential services providers in Australia, employs many local people at Puckapunyal. Ventia provide excellent support and opportunities including Work Experience and education and training scholarships for young people in our region. The group were exposed to a variety of career options that are offered on the base for civilians who are not members of the Australian Defence Force. The visits included:

- a production kitchen and a discussion on Hospitality careers
- the Puckapunyal Base fire station for an exploration of Emergency Services careers
- the Lands and Environment department with an overview of Horticulture careers
- Maintenance and Support Services
- Domestic Services headquarters for a discussion around the opportunities for cleaners and Health & Fitness Industry careers such as Life Guards.

## Visit to the veggie garden



This week the Ag Studies class have begun working in the school garden with the Junior Primary students. Last year the College successfully applied for the Woolworths School Garden grant. A stipulation of being awarded the grant was that the funds would be used to develop participation in gardening in the Junior Primary cohort. Two large garden beds were purchased and set aside for Junior Primary use. On Tuesday the Ag Studies students assisted while very keen students from Foundation B planted carrot seeds and spinach seedlings. The Foundation students were also given a guided tour of the garden area where they were encouraged to pick and eat the snow peas, cabbages and broccoli. On each Tuesday afternoon in week A, for the remainder of the year, all of the Junior Primary classes will have the opportunity to visit the school garden and to participate in its growth and development.

As our plantings mature to harvestable size, picking and preparing will become key activities. We look forward with excitement to the coming months!

On Tuesday afternoon Foundation B was very lucky to go for a visit to the garden with Mr Allen and the Year 9&10 agriculture class.

The students had an absolute ball exploring the garden and learning about the different vegetables that are being grown over the winter months.
