Year 10 Exams

Year 10 exams for core subjects will take place from Friday 17th - Wednesday 23rd November. All year 10 students have been provided with a revision booklet that provides information about the topics that will be covered by each specific subject. The students have also been given revision planning resources and mind maps to help them organise their time.



Exams provide our students with the opportunity to demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of the content that they have covered over Semester Two, but they can also be a point of stress. Taking an exam is a skill, and as our year 10's move into their senior education pathways, it is vital that they have as much opportunity to practise exam technique as possible. Our Year 10 students have had the opportunity to take part in study skills and time management sessions, which were run by Elevate Education earlier in the school year. These provided a wealth of resources, tips and hints as to how to approach this time of the year.

In order to help at home some of the following tips and advice can be valuable:

- Put the exam timetable in a central place this helps to be organised for the day.
- Provide a quiet place for study if possible.
- Discuss work hours with your child and their employer often shifts can be managed cooperatively at this time of year.
- Make sure rest and recovery time is built into the revision schedule.
- Manage time on devices.
- Encourage your child to get as much sleep as possible.
- Encourage a good breakfast the morning of the exam.
- Be prepared with the correct stationery and resources for the exam.

Moving towards the end of the year

We are rapidly approaching the end of the academic year and our students' thoughts are already moving to 2023. The end of the academic year provides our students with the opportunity to consolidate the learning that has been taking place throughout this year. The PAM portal and subject teachers for our secondary students, and your child's class teacher in primary are key in discussion for the learning which is taking place and for keeping updated with any assessments that are due.

VCE and VCE/VM 2024 Update

Our 2024 subject offering is finalised and Ms McLaughlin is leading the VCE and VCE/VM team in completing the necessary compliance and paperwork with the Victorian Curriculum Assessment Authority and the Melbourne Archdiocese of Catholic Schools. BRIDGE Program Australia-Indonesia

It takes a village to educate a child In Singkawang, West Kalimantan, Indonesia, education transcends across countries and communities. BRIDGE school, SMPN 20 Singkawang and their partner school, St. Mary's College, Australia, have been collaborating on agrotourism. Projects were initially funded by the BRIDGE program and have been sustained by the two schools with support from the district government and National Education Office BRIDGE schools, SMPN 16 and 17 and 20 of their students received scholarships from the local district and the National Office provided SMPN 20 with 15 laptops for their computer lab. BRIDGE teachers in West Kalimantan also shared their knowledge and experiences from the BRIDGE program to other teachers in the area, including the skills they gain from a cyber safety workshop.
