Dear Parents and Guardians.

The term has passed by ever so quickly. Perhaps the same can be said for 2022 with the beginning of the year moving out of Covid and over recent months and continuing on, across the Eastern States there is the flood crisis. In the last Marian I mentioned all 'Australian States are in the midst of a teacher shortage'. Teacher shortage is a reality that all schools are challenged with. The State Government offers State School teachers attractive financial incentives to move, the non-government system cannot afford such a luxury, yet both systems are struggling to attract teaching staff.

Over the past weeks the College has been advertising positions. Soon there will be announcements to the College community of new 2023 teaching and non-teaching staff joining St Mary's. We have been successful in appointing some excellent candidates for positions in 2023 and will be re advertising for positions not filled. There are city and rural schools who have not received one application after multiple advertisements. Teaching has its moments, but the profession is a joy to behold and receiving parent support is always appreciated and valued.

Remembrance Day and Garden Art













Thank you to Mrs Kerris for all the organisation for Remembrance Day and to Ms Yardley our creative and colourful primary Art teacher for the creative displays appearing in our gardens. Bringing the world of art and colour to our College gardens puts smiles on faces! Our student representatives were very impressive in representing our College at both the Army Base and the Hospital Cenotaph and St Mary's front lawns were a blanket of Poppies. Our students attended a College Remembrance Service with Mr Dudfield playing the Last Post and Mr Allen leading the National Anthem. Respect and silence were very present.

Wellbeing

In 2023 Mrs Mac (Hanlon) and Mr Goring will be the inaugural Secondary Wellbeing House Leaders for McAuley and Padua. Naomi and Xavier will meet regularly with House Mentors and with their Houses enabling students to develop a strong

connection to their House developing consistent routines and expectations. The College will be advertising for a counsellor to begin in 2023. Since 2021 this position has been difficult to fill considering the current climate of societal mental health demands. The College have met with La Trobe University to discuss the possibility of developing a partnership for regular placement of Allied Health students and undergraduate students studying teaching. In 2023 parents will receive a flow chart of Line Management for student wellbeing communications.

College Review 2023

All MACS schools are reviewed every 4 years. St Mary's will be reviewed Monday 28th -Tuesday 29th August. The reviewer is Mary Lovelock, former Assistant Director Ballarat Diocese and has worked for Victorian Curriculum Assessment Authority and the Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools.

Yea Bus Run

Letters have gone to current families who travel from Yea to inform them the College will run a direct route from Yea in 2023 for students attending St Mary's secondary. Seymour Coaches will be contracted for the run and have been excellent in the dialogue that has taken place to get to a contractual stage. This run will ease the travel time for students who catch the bus from Yea. Any passenger enquiries to catch the bus will be considered on application.

Enrolments 2023

Current enrolments suggest the College will be approximately 530 plus students to begin 2023. This is an increase of 60 students since the beginning of 2022.

Benchmarking Quality Practice in Career Development Programs

Kerry Brookes from The Australian Centre for Careers Education completed a College Careers Benchmarking Report. The cost of the audit is subsidised by MACS who encourage all schools with VCE to undertake the benchmarking audit. A St Mary's Careers Service Action Plan will be written for 2023 in preparation for 2024.

PLC Landscaping

Landscaping will begin in January alongside the Primary Learning Centre. As part of the landscaping the peppercorn trees will be replaced with established trees. The peppercorn trees are hollowing out, a haven for ant nests and attract the wasps.

Fencing

The original contractors who erected the fencing along the railway line and McIntyre Street will fence the creek and the College from the parish. The Church and hall will also be fenced off - this is a MACS and VRQA requirement.

Multi-Purpose Hall

A 6-metre fan with funding support from the P&F will be attached on the hall ceiling. The fan will take the sting off those hot and suffocating summer days.

Night-time Visitors

The College had some visitors (trespassers) this week. The Canteen was broken into with some contents stolen. The Seymour Police Crimes Unit are investigating.

Next Thursday 24th November we farewell Year 10 with a College Mass and Morning Team for the Year 10 students and parents. On Friday 25th November Year 10 will gather for a final luncheon together before taking the 'Final Walk'. Staff and all students will form a guard of honour from the hall to the High Street entrance in honour of Year 10 to thank them for their years of service to St Mary's College.

Let us be thankful for what we have and may we all see the beauty of each tree in the woods, rather than allowing things that will not cause our worlds to crumble.............. dominate. Our students need and deserve to see those trees as much as we need too.




Prayer for Remembrance Day

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


PAM – Simplifying Communications



Our world is increasingly mobile, and the majority of parents use a mobile phone to connect to PAM (pam.smseymour.catholic.edu.au). Menus in PAM on the mobile are a little more compact viewing than on a computer. To look for particular menu areas in SIMON firstly select


This week you will receive a notification to update your permission for the school to use photos and recorded images of your child. This is completed in a new area opened to parents titled Connect.

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Year 4 Healesville Sanctuary Excursion

All of the staff at Healesville Sanctuary were really lovely and we learned lots of interesting facts about all the animals. The Zoo Keepers take good care of all the animals and get to release animals back into nature.

We saw a bronze statue of a toilet roll and when we asked the Zoo Keeper about it, we talked about how trees are too important to chop down for toilet paper. This is because trees provide a home for wildlife, it helps keep our air clean and helps stop erosion.

My favourite part of the day was going to the Australian Wildlife Health Centre and watching vets operate on a Tasmanian Devil. I learned that if a diseased Tasmanian Devil fights another, it will pass on the disease.

There were lots of interesting facts about all the animals – it was great. The koalas and kangaroos were cute and we saw and heard so many different types of birds. We got to see Zoo Keepers feeding echidnas and it was cool to see wallabies up close.

I really enjoyed walking through the light hail when we did our workshop with the teachers. It was amazing getting to hold different animals' skulls. I got to touch and feel the skull and teeth of a wombat, dingo and platypus. The platypus was tiny and the dingo had lots of sharp teeth – like a dog!

There were so many cool places to stop and play. Even though it was mostly rainy we did get time to stop and play at some them. I would like to go back and explore more as the day went so fast!

We watched the 'Spirit of the Sky' and saw a bird dance. We learnt all about birds.

We all had Marnie the Wedge-tailed-eagle fly over our heads and we went to see the emus. Their names were Drum and Blinky.

I saw a wild platypus in the creek. A bird called Kevin could dance and talk. Tasmanian Devils are getting extinct because of a cancer.

On Wednesday at Healesville Sanctuary, we saw a Tasmanian Devil getting a check up and the oldest platypus in the world at 29 years old. We also learnt some facts about the Tree Kangaroo, Tree Kangaroos always have blue eyes and can jump 18 metres. We also met a bird called Kevin and he could talk and dance.

I saw a wild Platypus in a creek and also a Tasmanian Devil that was getting treatment for his mouth. And finally, the oldest Platypus in the world 29 Years old. And a Cockatoo that could speak named Kevin and he was a comedian.
