This young lady was left a lot of money by an elderly couple she assisted. She did not know they were wealthy, not that she would have cared. She did not help them for any monetary gain.

When the elderly couple died, their Will was left to the young lady – a lot of money.

Imagine having that wealth back then - never work again; beautiful house; buy what she wanted; attend what she wanted and servants galore......not quite!

She saw a need that caused her sleepless nights. She struggled with having such wealth yet living amongst poverty.



A decision was made, her heart was filled with joy. All the money – every cent went into a building that would welcome with open arms the ill, the helpless and the homeless. Who would have thought that decision would lead to Mercy Hospitals and Mercy Schools being establishes across the world.

I tell each family that it only takes one decision and what was a simple act of kindness by that young lady to build that building, changed lives and brought joy to many hearts.

Catherine McAuley (that young lady) founded the Sisters of Mercy and St Mary's College Seymour honours and lives the Mercy values both in *heart and in mind*.

Director of Faith and Mission



At Advent and Christmas, we celebrate the birth of our Lord, we give praise and thanks, we reconnect with family and friends, and we think about our life and faith as Catholics. How can we celebrate the season in meaningful and positive ways, in line with Catholic doctrine and social teachings?



Beginning the Church's liturgical year, Advent, (from Latin adventus, "coming"), is the four-week period of preparation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ at Christmas. Advent also directs our hearts and minds to what we can do for others as we prepare for Christmas. It started last the Sunday and ends on the fourth Sunday before 25 December.

Throughout the weeks of Advent, we are invited to prepare ourselves and renew our commitment to others and our relationship with our God. We might be encouraged to seize the day and make the time to be with those we love now, rather than wait for the big Christmas gathering. We might make good, relationships that have not been nourished or reach out to those in our lives whom we need to walk more closely with. We may commit to spending more time connecting with God or seeking him in all we meet and in everything we experience.

Our College has had the tradition over the last 12 years to choose a student to 'light' our large Advent candles out the front of the Mercy Centre. The candles and the purple draped cross, at the High St. entrance, are a reminder to the community that we have moved into the season of Advent. This week the Year 2 students were in charge of lighting our first candle- the candle of HOPE.

At the start of each week of Advent our students are involved in an Advent prayer, and the lighting of a candle in a wreath.

In some classrooms, students have been making Advent Calendars. In Year 4 the students have thought about things they can do in readiness for Christmas – acts of kindness. They have written them onto paper chains, which they will slowly work through over the next 4 weeks.

A big thank you to everyone for supporting Scholastic Book Club this year as it helps fill our Library with heaps of great books for you to enjoy.


