

# Data Analyst

#### Dear Parents/Guardians

In January 2023, your PAM account will be undergoing a major upgrade to provide greater security and other improved functionality.

During the week of the 16<sup>th</sup> of January 2023, your current PAM account will cease to function.

New PAM accounts will then be created by your school, and you will receive an email asking you to create new credentials for a new PAM account.

This will be as simple as:

- clicking on the link provided in the email
- following the prompts to create a new password for your new account.

#### Your username will be your email address.

Your PAM interface will not look any different, but you may receive an account per parent if you were previously sharing an account with your spouse.

Please refer to the below FAQs for further information:

- 1. We have a single, family email address that is used by both parents. Is that still ok?
  - 1. If the parents both use the same email address, you will only receive a PAM account for one parent.
  - 2. Example single email:

Parent 1 - Mother - Mrs Joanne Smith - jandcsmith@myemail.com

Parent 2 - Father - Mr Chris Smith - jandcsmith@myemail.com

A PAM ACCOUNT CAN ONLY BE ASSIGNED TO ONE PARENT, who can then share their login credentials with their spouse.

- 2. I do not have an email address OR have not provided my email address to the school.
  - 1. Parents with no email address provided cannot have a PAM account
- 3. Will any historic data be lost in this process?
  - 1. While no data will be lost in this process, it is possible that some information may become disconnected from the new account, such as historic letters, historic excursion permission and historic parent notified absences.
  - 2. You may have to review your personal details (Medicare number etc) if you previously had split access with another parent to your child's medical information.
  - You will definitely still be able to access historic student assessment reports and learning area
    assessment tasks. However, access to historical parent reflections may be lost if the school has
    chosen to not allow parents to see reflections by other parent accounts attached to that
    student.

#### 4. What do I need to do now?

- 1. This letter is to simply let you know about the changes that are coming. Right now, the best thing you can do is make sure that the school has your preferred email address on file.
- 5. What do I need to do in January?
  - 1. Be aware that your current PAM account will stop working as of the 16<sup>th</sup> of January.
  - 2. Look out for the email later in that week asking you to set up credentials for your new account (this may go to your junk/spam folder).

# Paper Plane Challenge

### The inaugural St Mary's College STEM Challenge - Flight School

On Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> December, Secondary teachers descended on Primary classrooms across the school for a day of STEM activities based around flight, culminating in a school-wide Paper Plane Challenge.

In F-2, students began by building on their Living Things science unit to explore birds, bats and bugs that can fly or glide. They then discussed the machines that humans have invented to help us fly.

Years 3, 4 and 5 spent the morning learning about aerodynamics and plane design, before visiting our F-2 classes as master-builders. It was fantastic to see our students patiently supporting their younger peers so that everyone was able to fold a plane to throw.

Meanwhile, Year 6 were busy learning about the importance of fair testing in Science. These young leaders compiled the rules of the competition, set up the flight zone in the Multipurpose Hall, and assigned important roles to ensure everything ran smoothly.

All students had a chance to challenge their classmates in our Paper Plane Challenge.

Congratulations to all staff and students on a fantastic STEM Challenge Day.
