#### Please note:



#### **2023 TUITION FEES AND LEVIES**

#### **CAMPS SPORTS EXCURSION FUND CSEF**

The Victorian Government provides this fund to assist eligible families with the costs of camps, sports and excursions. To be eligible for the fund, a parent of a student attending a Victorian school must be the holder of an eligible **Centrelink Health Care Card, Veterans Affairs Card** or **Pensioner Concession Card** as at the first day of Term One or Term Two.

The amounts payable for 2023 are \$125 for a primary student and \$225 for a secondary student. The funds are received at the College and go directly towards the payment of the excursion/camp levy.

We ask that parents <u>submit their application</u> to the school by **1st March**. However, parents who received CSEF at the school in 2022 do not need to complete an application form in 2023, providing that we have a current version of your Concession Card and there has been no change to your family circumstances. Application forms are available at the College office.

#### **CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE**

This allowance is payable to those families who reside more than 4.8 kms from the College or nearest free bus service. Families who wish to claim this allowance for the first time are asked to contact the College Office for an application form. Those families who received Conveyance Allowance last year need not re- apply. Please note, however, that a new form must be completed if there has been a change of address or if there has been a change in circumstances which may affect the payment of this allowance. Application forms are available at the College office, please return applications to the College by 1st March.

## **College Nurse**

Welcome back students and families and a very warm welcome to our newbies. My door is always open, and I encourage you to pop in with any concerns, questions or just to say hello.

#### A few updates and reminders from the Health Centre.

All existing and new Students need their Medical Profiles entered and/or updated in PAM as soon as possible please. To ensure safety, students will not be allowed to attend camps/excursions if staff are unable to access this information. We apologise if you are having difficulties accessing PAM. There have been statewide glitches not in our control. Please call the office for assistance if you are still unable to access. I can assist you to complete a hard copy over the phone or in person if required.

For care and coordination of student's health needs, there are several processes and documents that need to be completed as per the Department of Education's requirements. The more we know and can prepare for, the safer and happier your children will be here at school. Please let me know if I can support you.

All Medication needs to be handed to the Nurse, in person by an adult and stored correctly in the Health Centre, to ensure its efficacy, safety and security. Please don't allow your child to carry medication in their bags/pockets and self-administer. Secondary students with asthma may carry their puffer if the Health Centre is alerted to this.

For any medication administered during the school day or on camps/excursions, we require a Medication Authorisation form to be completed. I will email this to all families for your convenience.

The Medication Authorisation form needs to be signed by a GP or Pharmacist. The local pharmacists are familiar with the new process. I would encourage you to take a copy when attending any GP appointments so it can be completed at the time.

If a student has an Asthma, Allergy or Anaphylaxis plan documenting the required medications, this form alone will suffice.

A recent change in policy now requires a Medication Authorisation form to be completed for ALL Medication. This includes commonly used Paracetamol (Panadol), Ibuprofen (Nurofen) and Antihistamines like Loratadine (Claratyne) and Cetirizine (Zyrtec), eye drops and prescribed topical creams.

The Health Centre is unable to stock a supply of paracetamol and antihistamines. Therefore, in addition to the Medication authorization form, please provide a small amount of required medication in its original bottle/box for your child's use during school hours.

Students who use an inhaler for Asthma, seasonally or regularly, require an Asthma Action Plan. I can provide a template for your GP to complete, or they can generate their own. Asthma Action Plans and Anaphylaxis Plans are required to be updated annually: most existing plans are now due.

I look forward to catching up with all of you.

# Child Care Subsidy

Child Care Subsidy, also referred to as CCS, offers different levels of financial support to assist families with the costs associated with childcare, including Before School Care, After School Care and Holiday Care. This means you can get up to 85% of your session fees covered by CCS. CCS is paid directly to the child care provider to reduce the fees you have to pay.

#### How it is calculated

How much you receive depends on your individual circumstances and is calculated using the following information:

- Your combined family income
- 2 Your level of activity

S Your childcare providers hourly rate

You can use the Centrelink Payment and Service Finder to calculate your estimated entitlement.

## To obtain the Child Care Subsidy

- Have or register for a myGov Account. If you don't have a myGov account go to https://my.gov.au/ and select Create a myGov account.
- Once you are in your myGov Account, link your account to Centrelink and complete the registration process.
- Complete your Child Care Subsidy Assessment
- Onfirm your enrolment with current provider

At the time of enrolling your child into Before, After or Holiday Care you will be required to provide a Customer Reference Number (CRN), issued once you have registered your MyGov account and linked it to Centrelink, along with the account holder and child/ren's date of birth.

Once you have booked your child into care you must then log back into your MyGov account to confirm your bookings with the provider.

All steps must be followed to ensure that you receive your CCS entitlements and not charged the full fees.
