

Communication

At St Mary's College we strongly value our partnership with parents and encourage clear, frequent and respectful communication.

Due to the duties of teachers both inside and outside of the classroom it is often difficult to directly contact a teacher by phone. Email is the preferred form of initial communication, as this enables staff to access and respond when they are not teaching or engaged in their other duties. Of course, for certain issues it is preferable to communicate more directly via phone: a request for a phone call is most easily made via email, clearly indicating the nature of your enquiry so that the staff member is best prepared to assist you.

College policy is that staff will respond to communication within two school days: we ask parents to please be patient in awaiting timely response.

We thank parents for your understanding and encourage you to contact your child's **Classroom Teacher** if in <u>Primary</u> and <u>House Mentor</u> Teacher if in <u>Secondary</u>, directly via email for feedback at any stage.



Parents and guardians can most **easily access a teacher's direct email via PAM**. Simply click on your child's profile picture and <u>select the link</u> 'Email Staff' to choose the relevant teacher of your child.

NAPLAN

You will now have received hard copy and online links to the NAPLAN Guidance for Parents. NAPLAN will start on Wednesday 15th March for our Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students.



Our testing schedule will run as follows:

Wednesday 15th March: Writing

Thursday 16th March: Reading and Conventions of Language

Friday 17th March: Numeracy

Catch up tests for any absent students will take place in the following week.

The way that NAPLAN is reported to schools and parents will change this year. The previous ten bands of achievement have now been replaced by the following four:

Exceeding, Strong, Developing and Needs Support.

These changes have been implemented by ACARA (Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority) to provide parents and schools with a better understanding of how students are achieving in literacy and numeracy. As the timing of the tests has now moved to earlier in the year, results from 2023 will not be directly comparable to results from 2022 and earlier.

The NAPLAN tests will take place online. It is therefore very important that students in Year 7 and 9 are charging their laptop every night in preparation for the following days' tests.

Our primary and secondary teachers have been engaging in a variety of professional development experiences aimed at continuing to build teacher expertise. Professional development has been undertaken in Mathematics, Literacy, Science, the Arts, Developmental Learning and Career Development. This learning is being implemented across our classrooms on a daily basis, ensuring that our students are able to make connections to and across their learning. number of activities planned for the rest of the



Capital Levy

Catholic Schools are an important member of local and regional communities. Whilst Catholic education is grateful for the funding, we receive there is a shortfall that requires fees and levies to be paid by parents.



All families contribute to a capital levy, which is utilised to enhance the school's facilities and educational programs. Year 10 Work Experience week is the last week of Term 2, 19th-23rd June.




Career interviews for Year 10 students have commenced this week to start them thinking about possible businesses and industries they may be interested in experiencing.

- increase their self-understanding, maturity, independence and self-confidence.

Students are placed with employers primarily to observe and learn – not to undertake activities which require extensive training or expertise.

Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (PACER) Years 5 and 6 Canberra Camp – 13th to 17th February 2023

Our Year 5 and 6 students have recently undertaken an education tour of the national capital. Students were given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education.

To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$45 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs.

The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion and following all eligibility requirements.

We are grateful to receive this contribution from the Australian Government to put towards allowing our Year 5 and 6 students to attend the Canberra camp over the course of a week, allowing them to experience as many of the PACER program educational experiences as possible.

Our students, staff and accompanying adults experienced so many amazing things over the week in Canberra and made some wonderful memories.

Visual Arts / Technology

Year 9 and 10 students worked collaboratively to paint a grid enlargement based on the art of Indigenous Australian Landscape Painter, Albert Namatjira

Learning intention

You will learn about color mixing and color matching. You will develop skills in drawing and painting from observation to understand stylistic features of the Australian landscape painter – Albert Namatjira. You will mix acrylic paint and aim to replicate the landscape painting using a grid enlargement technique.

Success criteria Students can replicate and explain techniques used by the artist to explore stylistic issues or concepts in their work. Students will create a collaborative artwork using a grid format and match each individual piece to form an enlarged artwork for display. The painted squares will be matched to another student's piece and be arranged like a puzzle type format. The enlarged artwork will closely represent the landscape "Palm Valley", 1940's by Australian artist Albert Namatjira.

The Australian art scene of the 1940s and 50s was dominated by landscapes typically painted from Anglo perspectives. Often from people who had very little connection with Indigenous culture. This was a period of government assimilation policy and laws that did not allow Indigenous people the same fundamental rights as other Australians. The rights to vote, own land, drink alcohol, and even the right to be an Australian citizen, were not granted until the 1967 referendum. One high point during this period, was the sudden appearance of the artist Albert Namatjira (1902–59). Namatjira was an extraordinary presence in Australian art, a leading figure in the development of Aboriginal rights. His works can be seen as expressions of traditional sites and sacred knowledge.


