Stage 0

In consultation with ROAM Architects and Sebastian Russell from MACS Capital Program Delivery Infrastructure Services and Capital Delivery team, the College is seeking expressions of interest to complete works on the Administration building: adding three meeting rooms; enlarging the Health Centre; providing an archives room and enlarging office space. Currently the College has one designated meeting space, which is not appropriate. The Health Centre needs to cater for the return of Year 12 and its current design does not meet future requirements for a growing student population. Another primary classroom is included in Stage 0 moving from the outdated portable classrooms. Stage 0 has been costed and the project will be determined by pricing, which in the current economic climate is tenuous.

Open Evening

The MACS 2030 vision for Catholic Education is Forming Lives to Enrich the World. To begin the Enrolments 2024 the College held an Open Evening on Thursday 4th May from 4.30pm to 7.00pm with tours every half hour. Tours were led by senior student leaders (our students are our greatest advertisement for St Mary's) and accompanied by a staff member. A BBQ was held for our visitors.

- increase their self-understanding, maturity, independence and self-confidence.

Students are placed with employers primarily to observe and learn – not to undertake activities which require extensive training or expertise.



Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden Foundation

Months after the flooding Coles reopened their doors on Friday the 21st of April. St Mary's was very blessed and appreciative to be invited as special guests and to receive a cheque of \$5000 from Coles to kickstart our vegetable garden. Coles is a sponsor of the Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden Foundation (SAKGF) which we re-joined this year. Together as educators the Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Gardens Foundation, Coles and St Mary's have combined to inform our youth about the positive health benefits, the feeling of joy and wellbeing from the growing, producing, cooking, and eating of healthy food. This is a benefit for our whole community.

We look forward to extending our relationship with Coles in Seymour. Events such as local visits to investigate the running of a store, Industry visits to see where the fresh products come from, initiatives such as "Explore a farm" and "Women in leadership" to look at. As well we look forward to our students gaining part time employment and participating in work experience at Coles.

At St Mary's we have an existing fruit and vegetable garden and a medicinal Indigenous Garden. This vegetable garden is called The Garden of Assisi after our patron Saint Francis. St Francis was known for his strong connection to the earth. This garden will now have an existing fence relocated to extend its size – nearly double in fact. With our Indigenous Garden, we are now planning to develop it further with edible Indigenous plants to complement our medicinal plants. St Mary's has an established worm composting system incorporating food waste from both our Primary and Secondary school.



Our junior school buddy system with the year 10s carries into the vegetable garden, making positive interactions grow throughout the school.

All of these projects will now be extended and increase in need with St. Mary's - returning to a VCE level. The VCE-VM subjects will utilise all these programs starting next year. An Agriculture study is currently being researched and this money may also be a starting block to that.

The money gratefully received will initially enhance these existing subjects.

St Mary's College genuinely appreciates this generous donation. We sincerely thank both the Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden Foundation and Coles. To Coles in Seymour, it is lovely to see your doors open again, and we look forward to working with you. Thank you.

Return to Term Two 2023

It has been a busy start to Term Two, and it has been wonderful to see our students return with such energy and positivity. Across the College there has been focus and engagement in classrooms, with our teachers and learning support staff providing a variety of rich and detailed learning experiences.

Reporting Changes

Our Staff Professional Development Day at the start of Term Two focused on developing the reporting system that we currently have at St. Mary's College. Families will still receive a report twice in the academic year using the recognised five point scale, however the format of the report is undergoing significant change. Our staff have worked hard on streamlining the curriculum achievement information that is provided in the report to give an accurate picture of current attainment, progress and areas for development. Also included in this are the new St. Mary's College 'Approaches to Learning'.

The 'Approaches to Learning' incorporate the core values from our primary and secondary 'Positive Behaviour for Learning' matrix and will give a clear picture of how our students are undertaking their daily learning routines.

Families with students in primary classes will see these changes implemented for the Semester One 2023 Reports. Families with students in the secondary sector will see these changes for the Semester Two 2023 reports. Further information will be presented closer to the time, with family information sessions and examples provided.

Year 10 exams

Term Two will be an especially busy one for our Year 10 students. Week 7, 5th – 9th June will see them sitting the Semester One exams. These will take place on the Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday of that week. Students will be provided with a full breakdown of the exam requirements and a timetable of the week. Year 10 will also undertake study skills sessions prior to this week which will provide revision and note taking strategies. We would encourage students to start the revision process earlier rather than later and to speak regularly to their class teachers for support.

PAM User Guide

During the Term 1 holiday period, a user guide for the updated PAM interface was released. It provides parents with details about how to navigate the Parent Access Module (PAM) that links to our school's Student Management System, SIMON.

PAM is one of our key methods of communicating to Secondary parents about students' learning progress. Parents can view teacher feedback provided to students about assessment tasks. Additionally, it is used across the entire school for the following:

- Medical Records
- · Academic Reporting
- Personalised Learning Plans
- Events, Excursion and Activity permissions
- Student information and student timetables
- Student Attendance
- Parent Teacher online bookings
- Requests via the Connect Field option
- Cocurricular event selection
- Student tasks and lesson plans (Secondary only)
- Emailing your child's teachers
- Communicating Parent Notified absences of students to the school
- A knowledge bank that contains key documents including policies and newsletters

In Term 1 of this year the Parent Digest was introduced which is a fortnightly overview of your Secondary student's attendance and task progress. We hope this has been a useful way to keep abreast of what your child is learning and to allow engagement on the task topics with your child.


Email Services: not receiving emails from the school?

The ICT Team are still working with external support providers to find a solution for parents who are not receiving emails from the school. This is a known issue with Hotmail, Yahoo and Outlook email services. If you suspect that you are not receiving email communication, please contact the office and they will connect you with our ICT technician. This will allow the school to work more directly with any parents affected by limitations in the above-mentioned email services.


Hoax E-mails

Several parents have contacted the school to inform their child's teacher and the ICT team that they have been receiving hoax style emails. A hoax email may look as though it is sent from a staff member. The best way to check if the email is authentic is to view the entire email address. Each mail server will vary in the way that you can view the entire email address.

Google G-mail - Select the expand triangle found after the name and review the entire email address of the sender



Outlook Live - Hover over the name and a window will pop up with the full email address of the contact.
