Fencing

Fencing contractors L & J Webb completed an extension of the fencing from the PLC Centre to down beside the Parish Hall. All gates, including the Crawford St gate at the pedestrian crossing, will be open of a morning prior to school and closed of an evening. The gates near the Multipurpose Hall will remain open into the evening until Our Patch after school care finishes so that parents can collect their children.

Across multiple sectors like health, education, the arts, politics and everything in between, they have set the many courses we follow.


The struggles of our Elders help to move us forward today. The equality we continue to fight for is found in their fight. Their tenacity and strength has carried the survival of our people.

Pathways for Year 9 students going into Year 10

Over the next few weeks Year 9 students will be given information regarding accelerated programs for 2024.

VCE Mathematics

In 2024, Year 10 students may be able to study VCE General Mathematics Units 1 & 2 (Year 11 subject) if they show a keen interest and strength in Mathematics. This will be subject to a discussion with teachers and parents and is not a guaranteed entry for all.

VET

Vocational Education and Training courses can be completed as part of a student's school studies. VCE VET courses are nationally recognised certificates that contribute to the completion of the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE). These are offered at other local schools and Tafe providers both locally and in Shepparton, Melbourne and surrounding suburbs.

SBAT

School-based Apprenticeships and Traineeships. A School-based Apprenticeship arrangement combines paid employment, one day per week as an apprentice or trainee, off-the-job vocational training (trade school or TAFE) and secondary school studies. Students must be **very** organised and will have a large workload both on and off the job. It is the student's responsibility to find a suitable employer. There are a wide variety of VET and SBAT courses available. Students will be given information regarding these in the coming weeks.

If a student is interested in one of these pathways, they will be interviewed for suitability. These options require a high level of organisation and dedication. Students that don't demonstrate these skills may not be accepted to participate.
