As I typed this week's Marian article the ABC News app has reported a hospital in Gaza was hit by a missile killing and injuring hundreds of people. Each side is blaming the other – nothing surprising with pointing the finger of blame. Since modern civilization and probably before that time has there ever been a time on earth when there was no war? Has our world lost sight of the basic understanding of respect, tolerance and kindness?

Our students are reminded daily that a simple act of kindness can change a life, can put a smile on a face and make an individual feel that they do matter.

When visiting our son's family last weekend, I was at a supermarket and watched an adult berate a young employee because the adult did not want to have to wait at the front counter to be served. When the Mercy Sisters established a school and hospital in a rural town, they became known as the walking nuns. The nuns would walk the streets visiting families and show all the qualities of their Orders values: *compassion, respect, integrity, justice, hope and joy.* If only these values could become more common place in the one-to-one interactions between people. It might lead to a world that truly believes in peace.

Recent data predicts the teaching shortage will be an issue for a few years to come before there is an uplift in applications to schools. 
DCO Education Assistance Scheme - Defence recognizes that some children may experience disruption to their education due to posting. To help overcome immediate educational difficulties, Defence students may be eligible to receive reimbursement for up to 14 weeks of face to face or web-based tutoring fees for each approved subject. This applies within 18 months of starting a new school in a new location.







The winner of this pick was Hugh well done for packing up and being ready to go home within 2 minutes after the parents arrived.
