

WEEK 1 ADVENT

Embracing the Spirit of ADVENT: A Season of Reflection and Anticipation

As the year gradually draws to a close, we find ourselves entering the cherished and meaningful Season of Advent. Beyond the hustle and bustle of daily routines, the four weeks invites us to pause, reflect, and prepare our hearts and minds for the Christmas celebration ahead.



A Time for Reflection: Advent, derived from the Latin word "adventus," meaning arrival or coming, heralds a period of introspection and contemplation. It offers us a chance to look within, to ponder the moments that shaped us throughout the year, and to recognize the lessons we've learned. Within our school, this season serves as an opportunity for students and staff alike to reflect on their personal journeys, acknowledging achievements, and embracing growth.

Anticipation and Preparation: With each passing week of Advent, we light candles symbolizing hope, peace, joy, and love. These candles represent not only the forthcoming festivities but also the values we cherish deeply. Advent encourages us to prepare not just for the joyous celebrations of the Christmas season but also for the arrival of something new and meaningful – the Birth of Jesus. In our school community, it's a time to prepare hearts and minds for, fostering an atmosphere of family and prayer.

FIRST SUNDAY

The first candle on the Advent wreath represents Hope – the first Sunday of Advent not only leads us to anticipate the birth of Christ but celebrate the beginning of a new liturgical season as well. It is purple, the primary color of Advent and a color symbolizing royalty. Sometimes called the "Prophecy Candle," the first candle harkens us back to Isaiah's foretelling of the birth of Christ and all of the promises God gave us in the Old Testament that would be fulfilled by the birth of Jesus.

Sunday, December 3

SECOND SUNDAY

The second candle on the Advent wreath represents Peace and is also purple. Often called the "Bethlehem Candle," this candle reminds us of Mary and Joseph's journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem before Mary gave birth to Jesus. It also builds on the meaning of the Prophecy Candle, recalling that after the division, destruction, and dispersion of the kingdom in the Old Testament, there might finally be peace on Earth.

Sunday, December 10

THIRD SUNDAY

The third candle of Advent symbolizes Joy. As we continue to approach Christmas Day, our joy grows more and more. It takes us back to the joyful anticipation of the shepherds who journeyed to see Jesus in Bethlehem, even before the wise men. On this third Sunday of Advent, which the Church calls "Gaudete Sunday," meaning rejoice or praise, we light the third candle and rejoice like the shepherds. For this reason, it is called the "Shepherd's Candle," and its color is pink, the liturgical color for joy.

Sunday, December 17

FOURTH SUNDAY

The fourth candle of Advent represents Love, the ultimate love of God that He might send His only Son for us. Called the "Angel's Candle," the fourth candle of Advent is lit the Sunday before Christmas, and it is the color purple, leading us to eagerly await the new Kingdom of God on earth.

Sunday, December 24

Unity and Compassion: Advent unites us in a shared anticipation. It's a season that transcends individual beliefs, bringing us together in a spirit of solidarity and compassion.

Our school embraces this unity, emphasizing kindness, understanding, and support for one another. We encourage acts of generosity and empathy, spreading warmth and light within our community.

As we immerse ourselves in the Season of Advent, let us carry its essence with us, both within our school and beyond.

May the spirit of reflection, anticipation, unity, and compassion permeate our actions, guiding us towards a holy Christmas, filled with love and family.



Small Sided Football Competition & St Scrosoppi Cup

This year's annual **Small Sided Football Competition**, followed by the **St Scrosoppi Cup**, was a resounding success. With 50 participants, and a crowd of 60 students watching the final, St. Mary's has shown that the world game has a place in Seymour.

The league, split into Junior (Years 7-8) and Middle Secondary (Years 9-10), came down to the final matchday. The 1st place of the Juniors, the Year 7 Strikers, fell to 3rd and did not qualify for the cup, and the difference between 2nd and 3rd in the Middle Secondary League fell to goal difference. The Semi-Finals brought more surprises, with both Year 8 Junior Secondary teams beating their Year 10 counterparts.






Walking into the St Scrosoppi Cup Final with the UEFA Champions League music playing, the stage was set for a match between Cool Kids, the previous seasons Runners Up, and Gold Jewels FC, a team who barely reached qualification in the league, coming off an upset victory against the Middle Secondary league winners.

The match was a very even battle of personalities. Finn Melville, a Year 6, looked for 2 goals to reach the title of top scorer – and the first to ever do so as a primary student. William Schaefer-Steel, a new student at the school, had the willpower to lead his team to break Cool Kids' undefeated streak in the ultimate way.

In the final moments of

the match, a cross from William Schaefer-Steel lobbed over to Kody Dougherty, who launched it into the bottom corner of the net. Defending their precarious 1-0 lead for the final two minutes, Gold Jewels FC immortalised their team as victors of the 2023 St Scrosoppi Cup.





Following the finals, the champion team had the chance to beat the teacher's team of Mr. Lloyd, Mr. Goring and Mr. Lubeck. Unfortunately,







Gold Jewels FC were overpowered in a 2-0 defeat to the teachers, who remain undefeated.

Science 'Headstart'

What a great Headstart week we have had in Science. Our year 7's have stepped up this week and put their knowledge of forces, energy and simple machines into practice designing catapults.

Congratulations Edenrose and Evie for launching their projectile over 7m!



The new Year 9 cohort extended their knowledge of light and body systems through their study of the eye. The dissection of an eyeball was a highlight, especially seeing the pearlescent tapetum and seeing newspaper print through the lens.

The Year 10's are preparing for future studies in evolution and climate change by exploring plate tectonics and the Gondwana supercontinent.

Our new Year 11 scientists are honing their scientific investigation and report writing skills in preparation for their VCE studies next year. What a great end to a year of science!

St John's First Aid in Schools program

On 14th November, the Primary students had St. John Ambulance attend school to run their free First Aid in Schools program. The program provides age-appropriate delivery of the **DRSABCD** action plan.

Through a storybook & song, the **Foundation**, **Year one** & **Year two** first aiders learnt how Johnny Bear identifies an emergency, puts the DANGER, RESPONSE and SEND FOR HELP strategy into action and helps call 000.

Following on from the Foundation – Grade 2 modules, **year three** & **four** first aiders revised '**DRS**' - which involved assessing for DANGERS, obtaining a RESPONSE and SENDING FOR HELP by calling Triple Zero. Drawing on a real-life scenario, the students met 'Uncle Frank' (a mannequin) who had been cooking choc chip cookies in the kitchen before falling unconscious on the floor.









They learnt how to check & clear his AIRWAY, assess his BREATHING and how and when to place a patient into the recovery position. Students were able to apply the knowledge they had learnt through an interactive game based on the **DRSAB** action plan.

The **year five** & **six** first aiders also met 'Uncle Frank' and explored the action plan. After first assessing DANGER & RESPONSE, SENDING FOR HELP by calling 000, checking Frank's AIRWAY & BREATHING, the students incorporated a practical component learning how to perform CPR and when it is required in a First Aid situation competently completing the **DRABC** action plan.

Students also participated in group problem-solving scenarios based on a variety of first aid situations allowing them to apply their knowledge.

The students were super keen and great representatives of St. Mary's College. Nurse Lisa & I will have lots of helpers to call on when we need first aid support!

Special thanks to **St. John Ambulance** who provide the training free of charge to primary school students.
